The program was expanding to include the NJ Department of Health Certification Program for Nursing Assistants in Long Term Care Facilities. With a master's degree in geriatric nursing, she thought she would be an excellent candidate to share her experience and knowledge with future caregivers. After 35 years of the program, including a major move to Halsey and updated facilities, hundreds have graduated as Certified Nursing Assistants and have been employed at hospitals and nursing homes. Knowing former students sought education and careers in healthcare is a source of pride and accomplishment for Mrs. Mulroy.

This year's Educational Service Provider of the Year for Adm. William F. Halsey, Jr. Health and Public Safety Academy was awarded to Mr. Adrian Ricardo Bennett. When he was in high school, Mr. Bennett was inspired to pursue a career in guidance by watching the unsolicited dedication of his own guidance counselor. He gives her an extreme amount of credit for his life and career success and maintains the career goal of helping children achieve success the way that she helped him.

Through his vast professional experiences as a literacy tutor and supervisor through the America Reads Program at Rutgers University, a permanent substitute teacher, a physical education teacher, and several roles at the New Jersey Division of Child Protection and Permanency among others, Mr. Bennett developed his ability to work compassionately, empathically, and cooperatively with students, teachers, administrators, and parents.
