25 EPS Schools Receive 2018 Union County Kids Dig In! Garden Grants

Twenty-Five district schools and providers received grants for their garden projects through the Union County Kids Dig In! school garden grant program as part of Freeholder Chairman Sergio Granados's 2018 Union County Plant a Seed grants initiative.

Schools with students in grades pre-K through 12 were eligible to apply for a Union County Kids Dig In grant. The grants are funded through the Union County Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust Fund.

The County presented the Union County Kids Dig In! grant program to each school district through its Open Space Trust Fund, offering a total of \$70,000 in grant assistance through revenues from golf fees administered through the fund.

The grant program covers produce gardens including vegetables, fruits, nuts, berries, herbs and spices, pollinator-attracting plants and plants for pest management. It does not cover ornamental plants or non-producing gardens.


Gardens must agree to set aside 30% of their harvest for community donation and enroll in Come Grow With Us!, a free countywide information and resource sharing network for community gardens.

Schools that applied for grants were given the option to apply for tools and equipment; for establishing a garden with four raised beds with soil, irrigation, soil amendments, seedlings and provisions for educational programs; for ten Earthboxes with soil, tools, soil amendments, seedlings and provisions for educational programs; and for funding to cover other garden types such as rooftop or hydroponic gardens.

Elizabeth Public Schools was among 16 districts within Union County to receive grants, joining Berkeley Heights, Clark, Cranford, Hillside, Kenilworth, Linden, Mountainside, New Providence, Plainfield, Rahway, Roselle, Scotch Plains, Union, Westfield, and Winfield.
