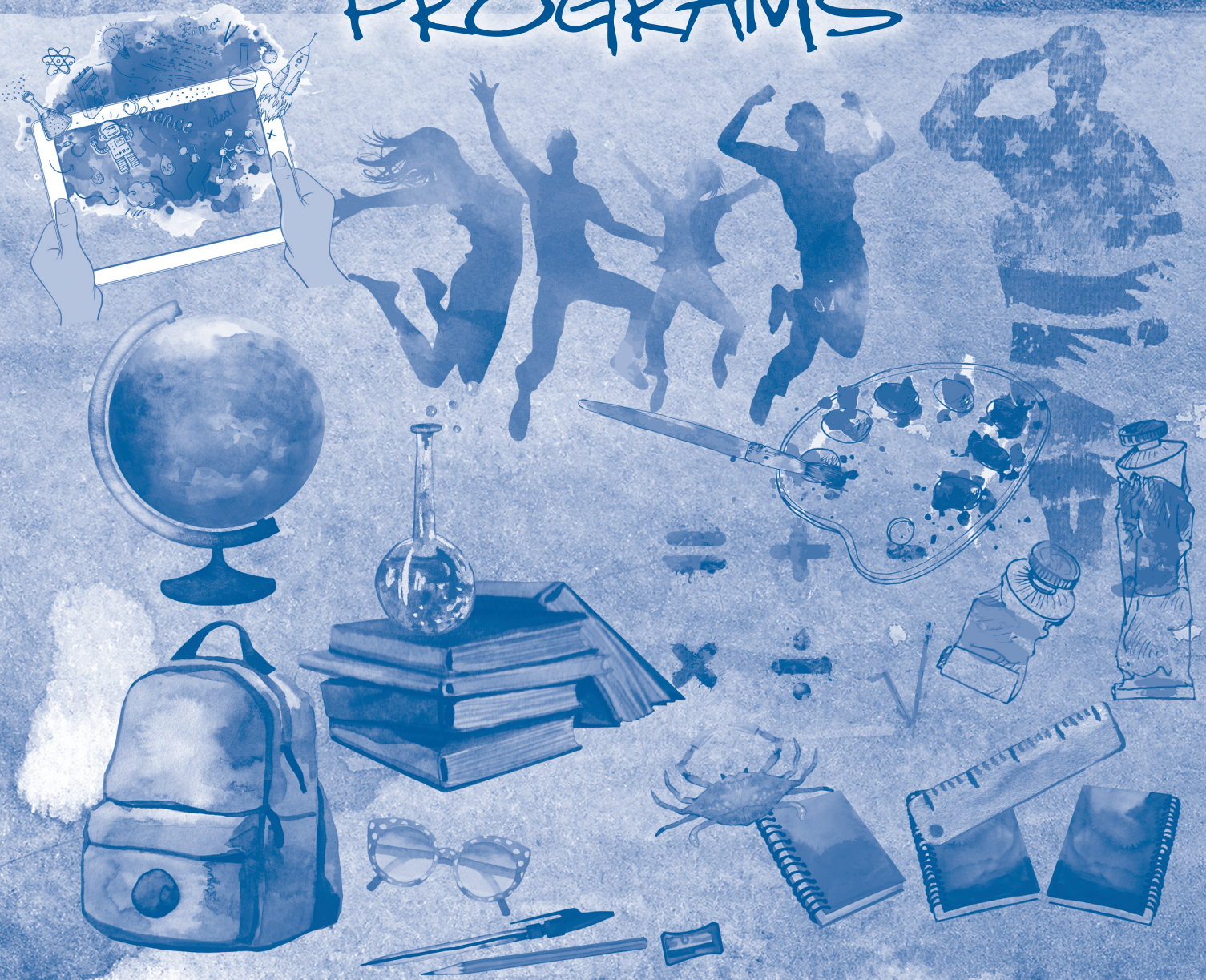

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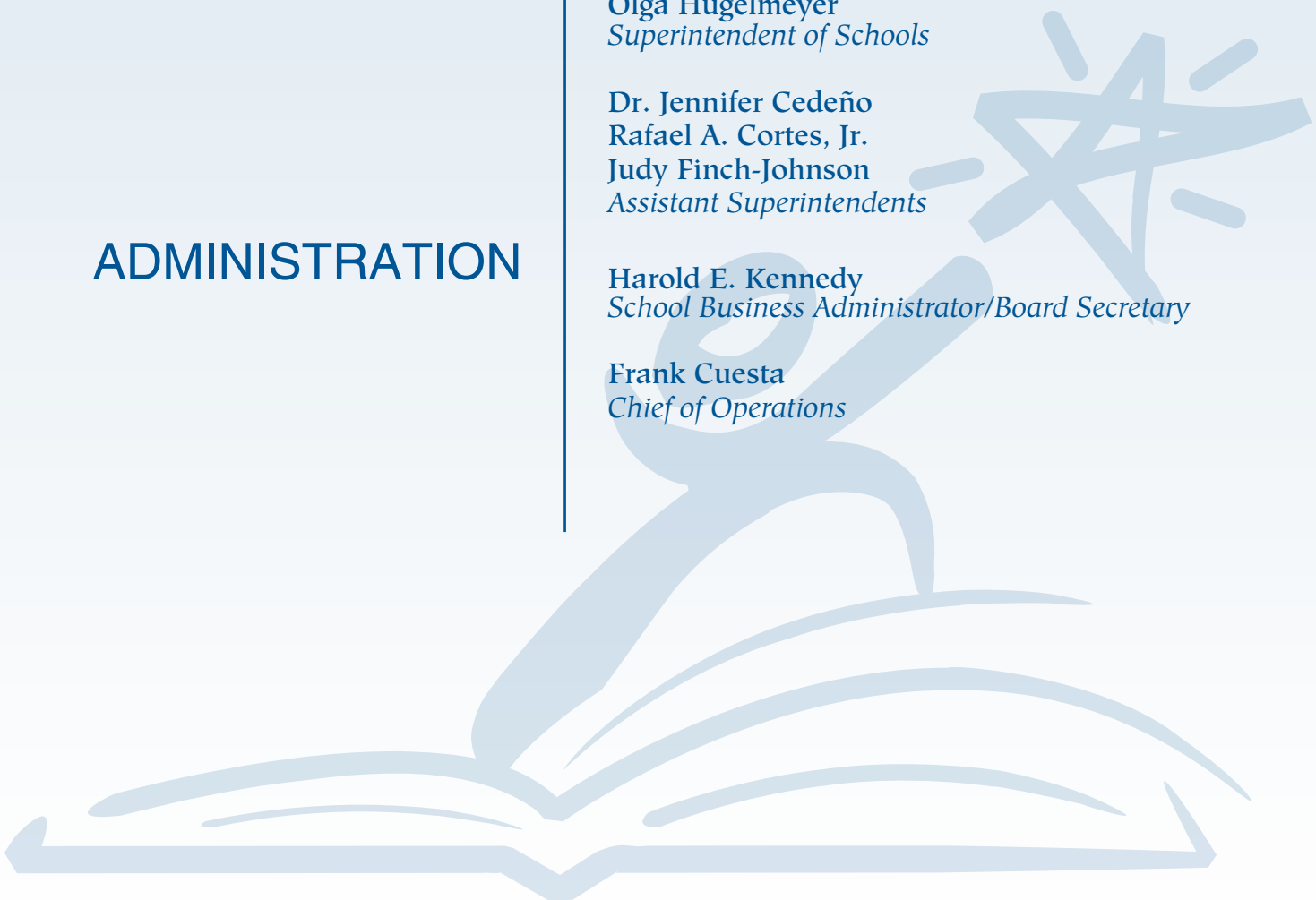

I am pleased to inform you that the Elizabeth Public Schools will once again provide its students with “A World of Summer Programs” in 2018.



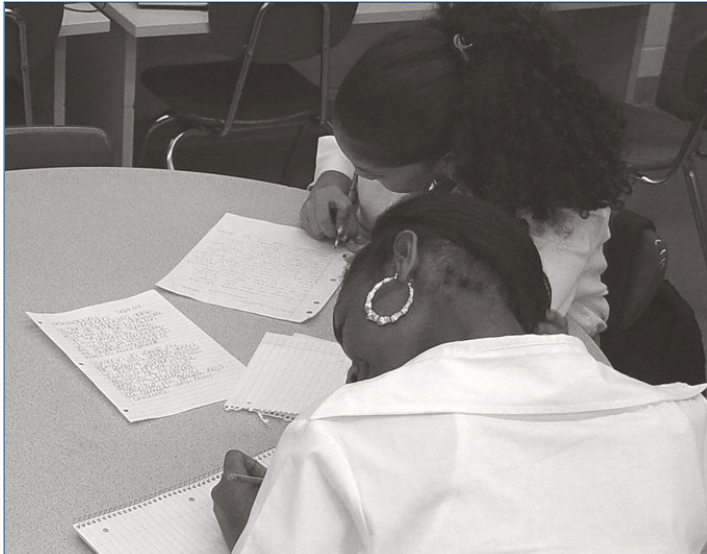
We look forward to working with your child during the summer and to achieving excellence together.

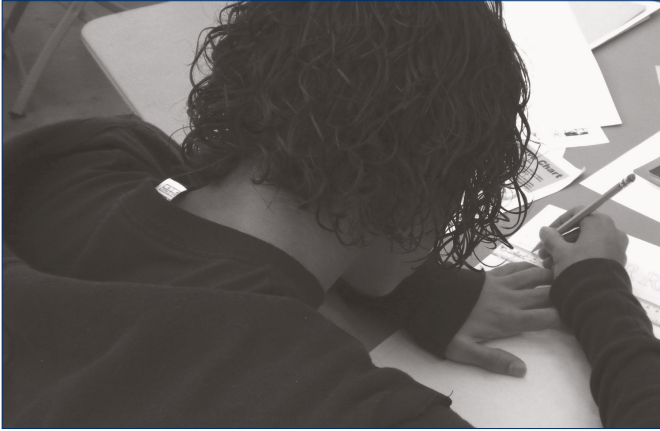

SUMMER SCHOOL REMEDiation 9 – 12

Each year, the Elizabeth Public Schools provides an opportunity for high school students who failed core courses during the school year to attend summer school to regain the credits lost. The first session runs from 8:00 am to 11:00 am, followed by the second session from 11:00 am to 2:15 pm. The classes offered are: Algebra I & II; Geometry, English I, II, III & IV; Biology; Chemistry; US History I & II; World History; English as a Second Language (ESL) I, II, III & IV; Spanish I & II; French I (Session I only) & II (Session II only) and Physical Education/Health. Each class is worth 5 credits. You will be notified by your principal if your child is required to attend.

PROMOTION/RETENTION K – 8

The K-8 Summer Promotion/Retention Program is for students currently in grades K-8 needing instruction in Reading, Language Arts, and Mathematics. This program will help targeted students achieve grade level proficiency and re-teach critical skills, as well as establish a foundation for the upcoming school year. Identified students will be provided with small-group literacy interventions to increase reading performance. Instruction follows the recognized district curricula and is aligned with the New Jersey Student Learning Standards (NJSLS). As such, students not meeting the district promotion standards are required to attend the program.

ESL ENRICHMENT

The English as a Second Language (ESL) Summer Enrichment Program is for selected students in the Bilingual/ESL Program currently in grades K through 12. The purpose of the ESL Summer Enrichment Program is to provide English language development and communication skills through a thematic unit approach.

The themes will integrate and support the district's science, mathematics and language arts literacy curricula, along with multicultural activities and experiences that will expand concepts of sharing and understanding across cultures. This promises to be an educational journey that will enrich the lives and will further the language acquisition of English Language Learners (ELL).

The READ program is for students with an Individualized Educational Plan.

SUMMER ARTS INSTITUTE GRADES K – 11

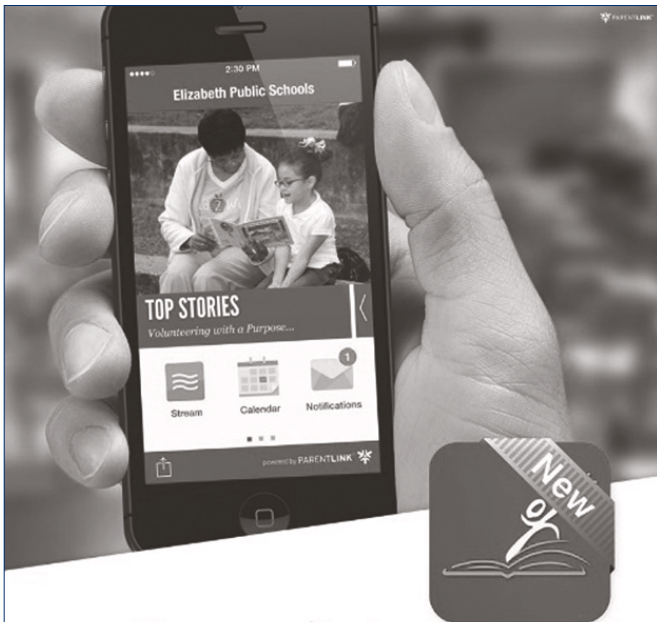
Have you ever thought of performing on stage, creating an artistic masterpiece or playing a musical instrument. You can experience all this and more at the Summer Arts Institute.
