RISING KINDERGARTEN LITERACY PROGRAM (ELA)

This program is for students currently in the Pre-K 4-year-old program needing instruction in language and literacy in preparation for kindergarten. This program will help targeted students build foundational skills that are necessary to become successful, confident learners as they enter elementary grades. Instruction will be provided by preschool teachers who are trained in the Orton-Gillingham, multisensory approach to teaching language and literacy.






