The George Washington Academy of Science and Engineering (No. 1)

Students who attend George Washington Academy – School No. 1 will join a school that is characterized with an approach to learning that emphasizes connections between science, engineering, and traditional subjects such as language arts, mathematics, social studies, the arts, and physical education. Rigorous instruction will require students to apply science and engineering principles to challenging, real-world experiences. Students will cultivate a deep understanding of how scientific knowledge is attained and how engineering solutions are developed by:

- Asking questions (for science) and defining problems (for engineering)
- Developing and using models as well as analyzing and interpreting data
- Constructing explanations (for science) and designing solutions (for engineering)
- Students will experience these practices through inquiry-based ("hands-on, minds-on") programs such as the Full Option Science System (FOSS), Engineering is Elementary, and the Technology Student Association (TSA)
- FIRST LEGO League a robotics program for students within grades 3-8 that is designed to initiate excitement for both science and technology and to teach students about valuable employment and life skills
- AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination)
- 'Engineering is Elementary' the nation's leading engineering curriculum for grades 6-8
- National Junior Honors Society

GWA students will also learn to become excellent stewards of their community through focused environmental initiatives.

Collectively, these experiences will enhance students' curiosity, capture their interest, motivate their continued study, and help them to recognize that the work of scientists and engineers is a creative profession that deeply affects the world in which we live. GWA will provide students with a foundation for careers within the 21st century and enable them to become informed, productive members of their community.
