Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

We, the entire staff here at **John E. Dwyer Technology Academy**, are honored and elated to welcome all of our students and family members to the 2023-2024 school year ***beginning on Friday, September 8th***! Our promise is to provide an innovative and personalized learning environment that ensures that every child achieves excellence. Within a safe, rigorous, and welcoming environment, we believe that every student can and will learn at his optimal level in order to reach his highest educational potential.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL / ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

The 2023–2024 school year will begin on Friday, September 8th, 2023. Instruction will be conducted during the hours of 7:45 a.m. to 2:29 p.m. In order to help facilitate both a smooth and orderly mode of transition during the times of arrival and dismissal, please adhere to the following safety procedures:

- Once students arrive to school, they will not be permitted to leave the premises. Classroom instruction will begin promptly at 7:45 a.m. Please plan to drop-off your child by 7:15 a.m. to allow adequate time for the student to go to his/her locker and report to class in a timely fashion.
- It is extremely important that all students arrive to school before the beginning of 1st Period to maximize their optimal learning experience. Students who arrive to school late invariably disrupt the educational process. Please refer to the student handbook regarding all tardy and attendance rules and procedures.

We would like to remind everyone that the driving speed limit, within the designated parameters of our school, should not exceed 25 mph. Traffic tends to back-up; so please plan to drop-off your child accordingly and drive safely.

On Friday, September 8th, 2023, students will be allowed to enter the building at 7:15 a.m. if they wish to eat breakfast. Students will report directly to the school cafeteria.



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- Upon arrival, students will enter through the metal detector. We are asking for all students to cooperate with our security staff.
- Open drinks and hot beverages are not permitted in the building.
- Headphones and electronic devices are not to be visible. Upon entering the building these items are to be put away.
- All students will follow the Homeroom Schedule on September 8th & 11th, 2023. Please note, on the front of the envelope received, there is a label with the student's Homeroom information on it. The student must bring the envelope on the first day of school and report directly to his/her homeroom; there he/she will receive a copy of the PowerSchool schedule.

Please know safety is of the utmost importance to us. Upon entering the building, all visitors must report to the security desk, sign in, show proper photo identification, receive a visitor's pass (if permitted, visitors must wear a mask), and then report to the main office where a secretary will assist them. Only individuals listed in PowerSchool will be allowed to pick-up the child. No parents/guardians or unapproved guests are allowed inside the classrooms.

EPS SCHOOL CALENDAR

POWERSCHOOL PARENT PORTAL INSTRUCTIONS

PowerSchool is an electronic management system that is utilized by the Elizabeth Public Schools in order to collect, store, and maintain pertinent student data and records. The application provides parents with real-time access to information that pertains to a student's schedule, attendance, grades, and academic progress; it also offers a convenient and accommodating way for both parents and teachers to communicate as needed. Therefore, everyone stays connected. Schedules for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year will be available to view on PowerSchool on **Wednesday, August 30th**.



NEW AND RETURNING PARENTS TO EPS

Parents of new students must request a new account in order to input all of the information required to navigate the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Parents of existing students will need to log in, input, and update any changed information that has occurred for their child.

UNIFORM POLICY

The intended purpose for the EPS dress code is to promote a positive self-image and to enhance school pride amongst our students. Health, safety, and educational well-being are the primary objectives for the dress code with the goal of fostering an environment that is conducive to discipline as well as to education. School uniforms are expected to be worn on a daily basis.

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Parents, we are asking for both your cooperation as well as your support regarding your child's adherence to the uniform policy. Students who do not adhere to the school uniform policy will not be permitted to enter the building on **Friday, September 8th** or any school day thereafter. Please do not hesitate to contact the main office if you should have any questions with respect to the uniform policy.

The school uniform must include the following:

- John E. Dwyer Green Polo or Green John E. Dwyer Oxford shirt
- Black pants, skirt, skorts only (no denim, ripped pants, cargoes, spandex, or Adidas pants)
- All black shoes (no UGG slippers, crocs, flip flops, slides, or open toed shoes)
- All black sweater or black Dwyer logo sweater

The Physical Education uniform must include the following:

- John E. Dwyer T-shirt or John E. Dwyer sweatshirt
- John E. Dwyer shorts or John E. Dwyer sweatpants
- Note: Grades 9-12 must bring their physical education uniform to change for their physical education classes

The following items are NOT allowed to be worn during the school day:

- Hoodies
- Jackets
- Hair accessories such as bandanas, headbands, and scarfs. Religious headgear is permitted.

All students are expected to be in full uniform on the first day of school on Friday, September 8th, 2023.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

For the past few years, our school has operated as a 1:1 technology school; and as a result, all students will continue to utilize a laptop computer for their daily classroom instruction. Students should make every effort to take excellent care of their laptops throughout the school year, as this is a very special privilege. Our 1:1 technology implementation will continue to ensure that our students attain the competitive standards that are needed to foster both college and career readiness. *All students are required to bring their charged laptops and power cords to school daily.*



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NEW ENTRANTS

All new students to the district will receive their laptop during the first week of school.

9TH GRADE STUDENTS

TRANSPORTATION

ABSENCES

Any student who accumulates more than nine (9) absences during the school year, in a subject area, may have credit for that course withheld even if absences are medically excused. Students who attain four (4) or more absences during the 4th marking period may have credit withheld.

Any student who is unprepared for physical education nine (9) times or more may have credit for that course withheld.

REPORT CARDS

Approximately every five weeks (8 times per year) either a progress report or a grade report will be mailed home. Each report lists important information. Class attendance and tardiness are also noted on both reports. Throughout the school year, please help us to stay on top of your child’s attendance and tardiness.

Guidance counselors and administrators are available to meet with you throughout the school year. Please call ahead for an appointment to discuss your concerns.
