FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL / ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

The 2023–2024 school year will begin on Friday, September 8th, 2023. Instruction will be conducted during the hours of 8:20 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Please arrive by 8:20 a.m. At that time, we will open the doors for the parents to drop off the students. In order for the students to adjust as quickly as possible, the teachers need to commence the routine immediately; therefore, please make your drop off as brief as possible.

Dismissal time begins at 2:50 p.m. **Please have the proper identification with picture when picking up or dropping off the students.** The doors will immediately close at 3:02 p.m. Please be on time to prevent the student from being marked late for drop off and/or pick up, as this will affect their attendance.



Parents will be dropping off and picking up the students from the designated side doors. The doors have been assigned according to the classrooms of the students:

POWERSCHOOL PARENT PORTAL INSTRUCTIONS

PowerSchool is an electronic management system that is utilized by the Elizabeth Public Schools in order to collect, store, and maintain pertinent student data and records. The application provides parents with real-time access to information that pertains to a student’s schedule, attendance, grades, and academic progress; it also offers a convenient and accommodating way for both parents and teachers to communicate as needed. Therefore, everyone stays connected. Schedules for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year will be available to view on PowerSchool on *Wednesday, August 30th*.

From there, please click on the "**PowerSchool Parent Portal Help**" tab. Please scroll down and click on the school that your child currently attends. You will then be directed to complete an online contact form. After clicking the **Save** and **Done** buttons at the bottom, your request will be submitted and someone from the school will be in contact with you as soon as possible.

UNIFORM POLICY

The intended purpose for the EPS dress code is to promote a positive self-image and to enhance school pride amongst our students. Health, safety, and educational well-being are the primary objectives for the dress code with the goal of fostering an environment that is conducive to discipline as well as to education. School uniforms are expected to be worn on a daily basis.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

The implementation of iPads into the preschool classrooms provides an opportunity for our youngest students to extend their learning through developmentally appropriate active-learning experiences. While the iPad can serve as a tool to help reinforce skills in the areas of reading, writing and mathematics, it can also provide opportunities for preschool students to investigate, explore, and create within the early childhood setting.

The implementation of the iPad is integrated seamlessly into the preschool curriculum during center time. iPads enhance student learning by providing opportunities for students to retell and create their own stories, investigate and explore exciting new places and diverse cultures, capture their learning through student created portfolios, and reinforce skills through books and learning applications.

NEW AND EXISTING PARENT INSTRUCTIONS

It is extremely important that we have the most updated home address and/or phone numbers so that we may contact you in the event of an emergency or to discuss your child's progress. Please be sure to update your contact information by logging into your PowerSchool Parent Portal and filling out the Emergency Information form found under the Forms link throughout the course of the school year should there be a change in either your home address and/or phone number. Open communication between the home and the school is expected and is one of the more pertinent keys to academic success in school.

Our Notification system enables staff members to contact parents through email, text, and through verbal messages recorded on the phone. Through this system, parents are immediately alerted of urgent information, major events, and/or upcoming dates. To ensure that this system will continue to operate in a highly effective manner, it is very important that we have **the most current and accurate information on file for each and every student.**

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Please be advised that the State of New Jersey, Department of Health Services, has changed several immunization requirements. All children attending licensed childcare centers and preschools are required to receive an annual flu vaccination.

Please provide proof of your child’s required immunization as soon as possible and ***no later than December 22nd, 2023***. Students who do not have the required documentation will be excluded from school as of ***January 2nd, 2024***.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation will be available for the following students:

- Elementary students who live more than 2.0 miles from their school
- High school students who live more than 2.5 miles from their school
- Students whose IEP include transportation services

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

On the first day of school, please send your child in with the following items:

- One crib sheet and one blanket (for rest time)



- Two family pictures to display on our family trees in our classrooms (this helps the child feel “at home” in a new environment)
- Two sets of clothes – pants, shirt, underwear, socks (in case of accidents)
- Please be sure to write your child’s name on any of his or her belongings.
- Toys from home are NOT permitted in school.
