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Dismissal time begins at 2:50 p.m. <u>Please have the proper identification with picture when</u> <u>picking up or dropping off the students.</u> The doors will immediately close at 3:02 p.m. Please be on time to prevent the student from being marked late for drop off and/or pick up, as this will affect their attendance.

Please be advised that the State of New Jersey, Department of Health Services, has changed several immunization requirements. All children attending licensed childcare centers and preschools are required to receive an annual flu vaccination.

Please provide proof of your child's required immunization as soon as possible and **no later than December 23**<sup>rd</sup>, **2022**. Students who do not have the required documentation will be excluded from school as of **January 3**<sup>rd</sup>, **2023**.
