Supplies and Expectations for 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Science, Math, Social Studies and Language Arts:

*Each student must have these items at school in every class, every day, for the entire year. Please label every item clearly with a permanent marker.*

Language Arts:

1 3-ring binder (1 inch to 2 inch size)  
Loose leaf notebook paper  
2 single-subject spiral notebooks  
50 5" x 3" index cards  
Post-it notes (used for annotation)  
Tape, glue sticks, highlighters

Social Studies:

1 3-ring binder (1 inch to 2 inch size)  
Loose leaf notebook paper  
1 folder (may not be shared with another class)  
2 spiral notebooks, 100 pages minimum  
2 glue sticks  
Pencils, highlighters, colored pens/pencils

Geometry

1 3-ring binder (2-inches) with loose leaf notebook paper.  
1 compass  
1 protractor  
1 ruler (6" or 12")  
Pencils, highlighter, and colored pens/pencils

Science

3 composition notebooks, 100 pages minimum  
1 folder  
8 glue sticks, 8 rolls of tape  
Sticky Notes  
Pencils, highlighters, and colored pens
