Dear Parents/Guardians and Families:

First Day of School / Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

The 2019 – 2020 school year will begin on *Thursday, September 5th, 2019.* Classes will be in session between the hours of *8:20 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.* In order to help facilitate a smooth transition, please adhere to the following arrival and dismissal procedures:

To orient our new and returning families to our Nicholas Murray Butler School No. 23 campus, please note that we are housed at three locations:

- **Pre-Kindergarten students** are located at the Dwyer 9th Grade Academy 501 Union Avenue. The classrooms can be accessed from both Union Avenue and Westminster Avenue.
- Grades Kindergarten 2 students and Grades 5-8 students are located at 631 Westminster Avenue.
 NOTE: New for the 2019 - 2020 school year, we will have a Grade 4 ABL class housed at the Main Building.
- Grades 3-4 students are located at the Mitchell Building 500 North Broad Street.

School No. 23 Main Building

- **Kindergarten students**, along with a parent/guardian, will enter the building via the Main Entrance at 8:20 a.m. and meet their teachers in the Gymnasium.
- Students in Grades 1-2 and 5-8 will meet their respective homeroom teachers on the field at 8:20 a.m.

School No. 23 Annex

- Students will enter the building via the assigned entrance.
- Teachers will meet the students in the Multi-Purpose Room located on the ground floor. *Only students will be permitted to enter the building*.

 NOTE: Please ensure that your child is aware of his/her homeroom assignment.

School No. 23 Pre-Kindergarten

- Students will enter via their assigned classrooms.
- Parents/Guardians will be permitted to briefly visit with the teacher.

Friday, September 6th, 2019 and thereafter

- **Kindergarten students** will enter at 8:20 a.m. via **Door #7** located by the playground. Dismissal will take place from the individual classroom doors at 2:55 p.m.
- Grades 1-2 students will enter at 8:20 a.m. via the Main Entrance A. Dismissal for students in Grade 1 will take place at Door #7 located by the playground. Dismissal for students in Grade 2 will take place via the Main Entrance.
- Grades 4-8 students will enter via the Main Entrance B.
 Dismissal for students in Grades 4-5 will take place via the Main Entrance.
 Dismissal for students in Grades 6-8 will take place via Door #13 located by the field.



Breakfast Program

School breakfast is served daily in our schools. It is imperative that you accurately complete a breakfast/lunch application so that your child's payment status can be determined. Applications and nutrition information may be found by visiting our district website at <u>www.epsnj.org</u>.

- Our breakfast program will continue to operate in the same manner in which it operated during the 2018-2019 school year.
- Breakfast will be served from 7:50 a.m. to 8:10 a.m. to students in Grades 5-8 at the Main Building and to students in Grades 3-4 at the Annex.
- Doors will open for students at both locations at 7:50 a.m. Students will not be permitted to enter for breakfast after 8:10 a.m.
- At 8:20 a.m., doors will reopen for the start of the school day. Please adhere to this schedule and ensure that your child is properly supervised until doors open at the designated times.

Please note that this is not a time for social gathering. Students who enter the building at 7:50 a.m. are expected to cooperate with the assigned staff members and enjoy breakfast with their classmates. However, any student who does not meet this expectation and compromises the safety of others will jeopardize participation in the breakfast program. Should this occur, the student will be unable to participate in the program for an assigned time period and a parent conference will be required prior to resuming participation.

Uniform Policy

Dress Code Guidelines are established to promote a standard of appearance which enhances the learning environment while allowing for the reasonable comfort of all students.

Uniforms are expected to be worn on a daily basis. Please note that hats, bandanas, scarves, and other inappropriate head gear, including hooded garments, are not part of the school uniform and should not be worn. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to purchase the proper school uniform for his/her child. If a student moves to another school that has a different school uniform, any purchase of a school uniform for the new school will also be the responsibility of the parent/guardian. **Khaki shorts must be knee high and only worn between May 15th and October 1st.

Please note that this is a standard uniform list for most neighborhood schools. The uniform policy is the same districtwide but may vary in color depending on the school/academy.

Please be sure to notify both the teacher *and* the main office at any time throughout the course of the school year if there is a change in address and/or a phone number. Electronic Devices and Other Personal Property

Cell phones, iPods, beepers, headphones, radios, and other electronic devices are not to be used in school. They will be confiscated if seen and a parent must come to school to pick up the confiscated items. Schools are not responsible for lost, damaged, or misplaced electronic devices. (EBOE Policy Code 5131)

Attendance

New Jersey statues require every parent / guardian or other persons having custody and control of a child between the ages of 6 and 16 years to cause such child regularly to attend the public schools of the district. A student must be in attendance for at least 171 of the 180-day school year (95%). In order to be considered to have successfully completed the instructional program requirements of the grade / course to which he/she is assigned, no more than a total of nine (9) absences is allowed. **(EBOE Policy Code 5113)**

Safety and Security

Please note that the safety of our students is of the upmost importance to us. Therefore, please have the proper photo identification readily available for the security guards in order to receive a visitor's pass upon entering the building. An orderly school environment is essential to the success of our learning program.

Health Related Information

By New Jersey state mandate, all Pre-K students must have the flue vaccination by January 1st in order to attend school. All incoming 6th grade students must have the Tdap and Menactra booster shots before returning to school in September 2019. For any and all medical updates or concerns, please contact the school nurse.

Back-to-School Night

For students in Grades Pre-Kindergarten – 2 and students in Grades 5-8, our Backto-School Night will be held on Tuesday, September 24th, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Main Building.

For students in Grades 3-4, *our Back-to-School Night will be held on Monday, September 25th, 2019 at 6:00 p.m.* in the Annex. During this time, parents will have the opportunity to speak with teachers, visit classrooms, and sign up for the PTO. Please consider signing up.
