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Course Description

This course is designed for English Language Learners (ELLs) at WIDA, (which originally stood for Wisconsin, Delaware, and Arkansas, is now a consortium that provides standards, assessments, and professional learning resources to support educators of multilingual learners (students learning English as a second language) in K-12 settings.) levels 1.5–3.9. Students will develop skills in all four language domains: **reading, writing, listening, and speaking**. Instruction is differentiated by level (EB or BDE) and integrates academic vocabulary, grammar structures, and content knowledge necessary for success in general education classrooms. Students will engage with fiction, nonfiction, informational texts, multimedia, and real-world scenarios.

Instructional Goals / Learning Objectives

By the end of this course, students will:

- Improve proficiency in **reading comprehension** of both literary and informational texts.
- Strengthen **writing fluency** through sentence and paragraph construction, short essays, and digital writing.
- Develop **listening skills** for academic and social contexts using videos, audio texts, and peer interaction.
- Increase **speaking confidence** using academic vocabulary in structured dialogues, presentations, and collaborative activities.
- Practice academic habits like time management, organization, and collaboration.

- Late Work: Accepted up to 1 week late for partial credit (up to 70%). All work must be submitted one week before the end of the semester for partial credit (30%)

- **Projects:** students will always be given at least a week to complete all projects. Late projects will receive partial credit. For every day late, ten points will be deducted.

Assessment Overview

- Formative Assessments: Weekly quizzes on vocabulary, grammar, or reading
- Unit Assessments: Reading comprehension, writing essays, listening tasks
- **Projects:** Group presentations, personal narratives, digital reflections
- **Benchmarks:** District-wide assessments 2–3 times/year
- SGOs (Student Growth Objectives): Assessed at beginning, middle, and end of academic year.

Class Procedures & Routines

- **Do Now:** First 5 minutes of class– grammar or vocabulary warm-up
- Exit Slip: Final 5 minutes of class summary, vocabulary, or short reflection
- Small Group Work: 2–3 times per week.
- Individual Work: Writing responses, online practice, or assessments
- **Participation:** Active engagement and English use in all domains (Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening).
