

Summer Math Practice for Incoming 5th Graders

Dear Students.


As you know, this coming September, you will be learning math at a 6th grade level in your 5th grade math classroom. To brush up on your 5th grade math skills and prepare you for the 6th grade math curriculum, it is important to practice and work to refine your skills during the summer months. You will use the Khan Academy website to gain an advantage and be better prepared for the coming school year. This will allow you extra practice and the opportunity to work at your own pace. Your work should be completed from June through August. Attached are directions on how to connect to your math teachers through Khan Academy and how to begin. Your math teachers will be monitoring your progress and you will receive credit for your hours spent on Khan Academy in September when you return to school. A rubric is below. Please plan to work on Khan Academy for at least 100 minutes per week. Try to set up a schedule for yourself. (For example: You may choose to work for 25 minutes on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday). You may use your home computer, a computer at the library or a friend or relative's computer. Be sure that you log in each time you visit Khan Academy to receive credit for your work! You should have at least 75% complete of the 5th Grade Course Mastery by September 9, 2022.

- 4. Next, the 5th grade teachers will assign you "Course Mastery".
- 5. Once you have been assigned it, click on Course Mastery and then 5th Grade.
- 6. Take the Mastery Challenge or choose any individual skill to work on.
- 7. Continue to work on the Course Mastery each time you log in.
- 8. Khan Academy will keep a record of the percentage that you have completed and send a report to your 5th grade math teacher. You can check your progress by clicking on Course Mastery.

Students entering Grade Five can complete an **optional** summer reading assignment, which is **due to their Language Arts teacher in September 2022.**

Students will select two books. Students are responsible for acquiring a copy of

each book on their own. They can be found at our school libraries, local bookstores or the Elizabeth Public Library.

Directions for Summer Reading Assignment:

Each student entering Grade 5 must complete a Notice and Note Reading Log (See attached supporting materials) for each book that he or she chooses. After completing the Notice and Note Reading Log, select one of the books and write the next chapter to the book. The chapter can be written from a different character's point of view or a twist to the ending. It will be your choice. The chapter can be from two to five pages long. This assignment will be worth one quiz grade, which will count towards the first marking period when students return in the fall. The grade for this assignment will be based on the attached rubric for Narrative writing.

 You may invent other details such as feelings or memories as long as they are consistent with and connected to the story content.
