Dear Parents, Guardians, and Caregivers

Elizabeth Public Schools remains committed to providing a high-quality education that prepares its students for college and career success.

School districts throughout the State of New Jersey continue to face unprecedented challenges in providing teaching and learning during the 2020-2021 school year. Since the pandemic began to affect the operations of schools in March 2020, not only has the way teachers instruct their students been affected, but also the way students are assessed to determine the skills and knowledge they have obtained. I would like to take this opportunity to provide important assessment information for 2020-2021 school year.

As you are aware, we are required by federal regulations to assess our students in English Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics in grades 3-10 and in Science in grades 5, 8, and 11 with the New Jersey Students Learning Assessment (NJSLA) or Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM). Additionally, all students in grades K-12 who qualify for supports as English Language Learners (ELLs) are required to take the *Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State for English Language Learners (ACCESS for ELLs)*. In light of the current national situation, the New Jersey Department of Education has not yet released the dates for these assessments.

The New Jersey Department of Education also requires us to administer benchmark assessments throughout the year in all content areas.
