Dear Parents and Guardians:

I want to take this opportunity to remind you that we will be administering the New Jersey Student Learning Assessment (NJSLA) to all students in grades 3 through 9 beginning after Spring Break. As you are aware, we are required by federal regulations to assess our students in English Language Arts/Literacy, mathematics, and science throughout elementary, middle, and high school.

The NJSLA may be administered any time between April 25, 2022 and June 3, 2022. The chart below details the dates that have been identified for each grade level and each content area. As you will notice, science is only assessed in grades 5, 8, and 11; and the NJSLA for English Language Arts and in mathematics is only administered in high school in grade 9.

## **Technology and State Assessment Security**

Students who are taking the NJSLA will use their school-issued laptop computer to complete all units of testing. Certain math and science tests allow for the use of calculators. Calculators are available to the students within the assessment and in some instances, students may be provided with a separate calculator. English Language Arts assessments in all grades, require headphones which will be provided by the school.

No other electronic devices are permitted in any room where assessments are being administered. This includes cell phones, ear buds, and SMART watches to name a few. Students who have an unauthorized electronic device in a testing room may have their entire test voided
