Dear Pre-Kindergarten Parents/Guardians and Families:

On behalf of the staff here at Dr. Orlando Edreira Academy School No. 26, it is with great pleasure that we welcome all of our new families as well as our returning families to the 2019 - 2020 school year! We are looking forward to a productive partnership with you in order to ensure that our children reach their highest academic potential possible. As partners, we will work together to nourish a rich and rewarding education for our students. The school year will be both inspiring and academically successful; as a result, together, we will supply every child with the necessary tools to become lifelong learners and outstanding citizens in the future. We share the responsibility for our children's success and we want you to know that we will work diligently to implement our mission – for we do believe it is very important that *every child achieves excellence*.

We are excited about the new academic year and all of the educational experiences we have planned for your child this year at our location on 1014 South Elmora Avenue. Our aim is to maximize your child's experiences both in and out of the classroom and to provide him/her with a world-class education.

First Day of School / Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

The 2019 – 2020 school year will begin on *Thursday, September 5th*, 2019. Classes will be in session between the hours of 8:20 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. In order to help facilitate a smooth transition, please adhere to the following arrival and dismissal procedures:

- All students who are eligible for transportation will receive a pick-up time in the mail from our Transportation Department. Those students will be picked-up in front of your house. As always, it is your choice to use the bus, if eligible, or provide your own means of transportation to get your child to school.
- School personnel will be available in the Gym on the first day of school to help students get situated and to provide you with your child's homeroom.



- For many children, this could be their first day within a school and that can be somewhat scary. It is our goal to help young children acclimate to school by providing a nurturing environment. It is also our goal to help them become accustomed to school routines as soon as possible. To that end, we encourage you to celebrate this milestone; however, beyond the first couple of days of school, we will limit the number of days in which you will be allowed to walk your child into his/her classroom.
- We also want to remind you that class begins at 8:20 a.m.; students who arrive late tend to miss out on instruction and cause disruption to a class already in session. We ask that, to avoid being marked late and possibly violate our attendance policy, please make every effort to arrive on time each day.

Breakfast Program

School breakfast is served daily in our schools. It is imperative that you accurately complete a breakfast/lunch application so that your child's payment status can be determined. Applications and nutrition information may be found by visiting our district website at www.epsnj.org.

Uniform Policy

Dress Code Guidelines are established to promote a standard of appearance which enhances the learning environment while allowing for the reasonable comfort of all students.

Uniforms are expected to be worn on a daily basis. Please note that hats, bandanas, scarves, and other inappropriate head gear, including hooded garments, are not part of the school uniform and should not be worn. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to purchase the proper school uniform for his/her child. If a student moves to another school that has a different school uniform, any purchase of a school uniform for the new school will also be the responsibility of the parent/guardian. (EBOE Policy Code 5132, 5133)

District's Code of Student Conduct

The Board of Education believes that an effective instructional program requires an orderly school environment and that the effectiveness of the educational program is, in part, reflected in the behavior of pupils. Attendance

New Jersey statues require every parent / guardian or other persons having custody and control of a child between the ages of 6 and 16 years to cause such child regularly to attend the public schools of the district. A student must be in attendance for at least 171 of the 180-day school year (95%). In order to be considered to have successfully completed the instructional program requirements of the grade / course to which he/she is assigned, no more than a total of nine (9) absences is allowed. (EBOE Policy Code 5113)

Health Related Information

By New Jersey state mandate, all Pre-K students must have the flue vaccination by January 1st in order to attend school. All incoming 6th grade students must have the Tdap and Menactra booster shots before returning to school in September 2019. For any and all medical updates or concerns, please contact the school nurse.

Our Back-to-School Night will be held on Wednesday, September 18th, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. During this time, parents will have the opportunity to speak with teachers, visit classrooms, and sign up for the PTO. Please consider signing up.

Dr. Orlando Edreira Academy School No. 26 is an authorized International Baccalaureate (IB) World School for all students in Grades PreK-8. We are designated as the only school in New Jersey authorized to offer the PYP (elementary) and MYP (middle) programs. School No. 26 is also the only school in Elizabeth offering these exciting programs where an inquiry method is utilized to help students learn and foster a greater understanding for all of the people with whom we share the planet. Students in Pre-K are also IB students. In the fall, we will have an IB Open House where you will learn more about this program and the unique opportunities that your child will have at Dr. Orlando Edreira Academy School No. 26. This last school year we were reauthorized with the International Baccalaureate and look forward to the next five years of further developing our program with your child and experiencing all the additional benefits of an IB education.

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First Day of School / Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

The 2019 – 2020 school year will begin on *Thursday, September 5th*, 2019. Classes will be in session between the hours of 7:30 a.m. until 3:05 p.m. In order to help facilitate a smooth transition, please adhere to the following arrival and dismissal procedures:

- Doors open at 7:05 a.m. for students.
- Near the end of the summer, all students, who are eligible for transportation, will receive information in the mail from our Transportation Department regarding appropriate pick-up times and locations. As always, it is your choice to use the bus, if eligible, or provide your own means of transporting your child to school.
- If you are eligible for busing and choose to take advantage of it, please remember that, for the first few weeks, busing can be stressful in trying to find the time in which your child's bus arrives at the stop and when they arrive home. So much of this is based on the route the bus takes, how many people are on the bus, and dealing with traffic patterns as all students in Elizabeth make their way back to school. I ask that you please be understanding until things settle down.



- School personnel will be in the Gym on the first day of school to provide you with your child's homeroom and to help **students in Grades K-4** get situated.
- Parents, please remind **students in Grades 5-8** to report to the cafeteria.
