


Why a resume or activities



sheet?

Students are submitting resumes or activities list to ensure the admissions office that they are applying to can get a better sense of who they are outside of the classroom



- It's resourceful for admissions counselors because it adds a different perspective
- Allows the evaluator (counselor) to see what the student has done in the last four years with his/her time outside and inside of school community
- Sometimes students run out of room on the application and submit a resume and activities list that shows ALL involvement, leadership roles, sometimes in more detail as well






Extracurricular

- Time management and responsibility




Gain Recognition


