Dear Parents/Guardians and Community Members:

As we wind down a very challenging and unprecedented year, we have many exciting events and activities that we look forward to celebrating. Below, please see the information related to the end of the school year and the summer.

Eighth Grade Promotion & Graduation/Class Awards Ceremonies

Elizabeth Public Schools is excited to announce that it will be holding indoor ceremonies for eighth grade promotion and for high school graduation to suitably recognize the outstanding milestone achievements of its eighth grade students and seniors of the graduating Class of 2021. Class awards will be incorporated into the high school graduation ceremonies.

In a press conference on Monday, June 4th, Governor Murphy noted the following about indoor gatherings:

- Removal of the general indoor gathering limit, which is currently at 50 people
- Removal of the indoor gathering limit for political gatherings, weddings, funerals, memorial services, performances, and other catered and commercial events, which is currently at 250 people
- Removal of the 30 percent capacity limitation for indoor large venues with a fixed-seating capacity over 1,000.

In consultation with Dr. Guillermo Munoz and the City of Elizabeth Health Officer, it has been determined that district schools can hold eighth grade promotion and graduation ceremonies indoors without issues pertaining to capacity. Additionally, the district has determined that capacity for any of the ceremonies, given the guidelines of two adults per student, will fall well below the capacity of any of the respective designated venues.

The schedule for eighth grade promotion ceremonies, which will be held at each respective PK/K-8 school, and high school graduation/class awards ceremonies, which will be held at the Dunn Sports Center, are as follows:

The 28th Annual Excellence Awards Dinner for the top 100 seniors of the graduating class of 2021 will take place on Wednesday, June 23, 2021.

High School Final Exams

Beginning Thursday, June 17, high school students will be administered final exams for the 2020-2021 school year. With the goal of returning to normalcy during the 2020-2021 school year, teachers and school administrators notified students in September and throughout the school year that final exams would be administered. In recognition of the extraordinary circumstances caused by the pandemic, we have set a minimum grade for final exams for this school year, in order to avoid harming a student's opportunity to pass a course. Final exams are important because they address knowledge and skills that may not have been mastered when benchmarks, unit tests, and other assessments were administered but may be mastered by the end of the school year; provide students an opportunity to bring up 20% of their final grade for the school year; provide an additional component of a course final grade to give new entrant students the opportunity to gain course credit; and provide educators and students in grades 9-11 with instructional and curricular feedback for the following school year.
