Dear Elizabeth Community Member:

The health, safety and well-being of all Elizabeth's residents and our school community's students, team members and families are a top priority for us. The following are new updates for our residents as promised regarding the COVID-19 virus.

- The Elizabeth Public Schools are closed until further notice. All school buildings are locked to the public.
- Our E-Remote home learning platform is now accessible through the district website.
- Students, parents and teachers should visit the district website epsnj.org to find needed information. All communications with our team members and parents will be through our online platform. District phones will not be used; please do not call your schools.
- Elizabeth Public Schools is offering a Grab and Go program from Monday through Friday, during this time of school closure. You may pick up a breakfast and lunch package for your child from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. You must qualify for free and reduced lunch to receive a package. - There are two new positive residential cases in Elizabeth, bringing our total to five. They are all self-quarantined at home.
- All Recreation & Senior Centers as well as playgrounds are closed until further notice.
- Elizabeth City Hall is open its regular hours of 9 a.m.-- 4 p.m.
- Police, fire and similar emergency services are operating at or above typical levels.
- Non-essential and non-emergency travel in New Jersey is strongly discouraged between the hours of 8:00 PM AND 5:00 AM. Essential businesses like supermarkets, pharmacies, medical offices, and gas stations may remain open past 8:00 PM.

We are in daily contact with federal, state and county officials to keep you informed and our services in place.
