Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

We, the entire staff here at *Madison-Monroe School No. 16*, are honored and elated to welcome all of our students and family members to the 2023-2024 school year *beginning on Friday, September 8th*! Our promise is to provide an innovative and personalized learning environment that ensures that every child achieves excellence. Within a safe, rigorous, and welcoming environment, we believe that every student can and will learn at his optimal level in order to reach his highest educational potential.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL / ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

The 2023–2024 school year will begin on Friday, September 8th, 2023. Instruction will be conducted during the hours of 8:20 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. In order to help facilitate both a smooth and orderly mode of transition during the times of arrival and dismissal, please adhere to the following safety procedures:

ARRIVAL:

The first day of school, *Friday, September* 8^{th} , is a full day of school for all students within grades Pre-K – 8. Please keep in mind that we will operate on a regular day schedule:

- **Pre-Kindergarten** will enter directly into their TCU units follow the directions on the map below.
- **Kindergarten and 1**st **Grade Students** will enter from the Monroe Avenue entrance and follow the directions on the enclosed map.
- 2nd and 3rd Grade Students will enter from the front North Avenue entrance and follow the directions on the enclosed map.
- 4th, 5th, and 6th Grade Students will enter through the Monroe Avenue entrance of the Main Building and follow the directions on the enclosed map.

• **7th and 8th Grade Students** will enter from the North Avenue entrance of the Main Building and follow the directions on the enclosed map.

DISMISSAL:

- **Pre-Kindergarten Students** will be dismissed at 2:55 p.m. via their TCUs.
- **Kindergarten Students** will be dismissed at 2:55 from the Monroe Avenue side of the building.
- 1st Grade Students will be dismissed at 3:00 p.m. from the Monroe Avenue side of the building.
- 2nd and 3rd Grade Students will be dismissed from the front entrance of North Avenue.
- **Rooms 3-107 and 3-B5** will exit from the side entrance near the Circle Garden on North Avenue.
- Grades 4th and 5th will be dismissed from North Avenue Main Building
- **Grade 6** will be dismissed from Monroe Avenue side of building of Main Building

NOTE: Parents, please wait for your child on the sidewalk and not in front of the entrance doorways or on the school steps. Please consider parking in the parking lot on Monroe Street. Please do not block the doors.

BUSSED STUDENTS will be called at 2:50 p.m. to board their buses.

It is imperative that students are picked-up on time at the end of the day at 3:00 p.m.

- If necessary, please make prior arrangements as to whom will be responsible for your child at dismissal. Please indicate where your child should meet the designated individual so that he/she can be picked-up or walked home.
- Teaching and instruction is in session until 2:55 p.m. every day for students who are not boarding a bus.
- If your child must be picked-up early, you must sign him/her out in one of the Main Offices and show proper identification. Remember that an early dismissal means that your child will miss some of his/her learning activity. All students, parents, and visitors must enter the building through the main entrance's security area of each building. **Parents and visitors are required to sign in and show appropriate identification.**
- An older child who is responsible for picking-up a younger child must wait outside of the younger child's designated exit or decide on a mutual meeting place outside of the building.
- Please park your car appropriately and obey all traffic laws as specified; we do not want you to get a ticket or to be in the midst of any kind of danger. North Avenue is often congested with both cars and trucks. Use the parking lot if necessary. Please do not double park.

POWERSCHOOL PARENT PORTAL INSTRUCTIONS

PowerSchool is an electronic management system that is utilized by the Elizabeth Public Schools in order to collect, store, and maintain pertinent student data and records. The application provides parents with real-time access to information that pertains to a student's schedule, attendance, grades, and academic progress; it also offers a convenient and accommodating way for both parents and teachers to communicate as needed. Therefore, everyone stays connected. Schedules for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year will be available to view on PowerSchool on *Wednesday, August 30th*.

NEW AND RETURNING PARENTS TO EPS

Parents of new students must request a new account in order to input all of the information required to navigate the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Parents of existing students will need to log in, input, and update any changed information that has occurred for their child.

You will then be directed to complete an online contact form. After clicking the *Save* and *Done* buttons at the bottom, your request will be submitted and someone from the school will be in contact with you as soon as possible.

UNIFORM POLICY

The intended purpose for the EPS dress code is to promote a positive self-image and to enhance school pride amongst our students. Health, safety, and educational well-being are the primary

objectives for the dress code with the goal of fostering an environment that is conducive to discipline as well as to education. School uniforms are expected to be worn on a daily basis.

Parents, we are asking for both your cooperation as well as your support regarding your child's adherence to the uniform policy. Students who do not adhere to the school uniform policy will not be permitted to enter the building on *Friday, September* δ^{th} or any school day thereafter. Please do not hesitate to contact the main office if you should have any questions with respect to the uniform policy.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

For the past few years, our school has operated as a 1:1 technology school; and as a result, all students will continue to utilize a *laptop computer* for their daily classroom instruction. Students should make every effort to take excellent care of their *laptops* throughout the school year, as this is a very special privilege. Our 1:1 technology implementation will continue to ensure that our students attain the competitive standards that are needed to foster both college and career readiness. *All students are required to bring their charged laptops and power cords to school daily*.

NEW ENTRANTS

All new students to the district will receive their laptop during the first week of school.

- Bookbags, folders, binders, pencil cases, sweaters, sweatshirts, and/or hoodies should be marked with the child's name in pen or marker.

- Please check your child's bookbag and folder daily for homework assignments and important communications.
- <u>Cell phones and IPods ARE NOT PERMITTED to BE USED in the school building</u> <u>during instructional time.</u>
- While it is understandable that many students have cell phones for emergency purposes, *cell phones must be turned off and placed in backpack.* If a student has a cell phone in his/her possession (out of backpack) beyond the front entrance, it will be confiscated. Parents will then be notified to retrieve the cell phone from the Principal's office.
- Lockers, for students in Grades 7 and 8, *are subject to search as in accordance with District Policy.*

Through this system, parents are immediately alerted of urgent information, major events, and/or upcoming dates. IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

The state of New Jersey has mandated that all children born after January 1st, 1997 and enrolled in Grade Six, <u>will be required to receive a booster dose of the diphtheria, tetanus and</u> <u>pertussis vaccine (Tdap) as well as one dose of meningococcal vaccine</u>. Documentation that your child has received the required sixth grade immunizations must be turned into the school nurse no later than *Friday, September 8th, 2023*.

Students entering 6th grade with birthdays on or after *Friday, September 8th, 2023* must provide written confirmation from your child's healthcare provider of the vaccination appointment. This appointment should be within two weeks of your child turning 11 years of age. The immunization record must be submitted immediately following the appointment. The Elizabeth Public School District is compelled by law to ensure that all students receive their required immunizations.

<u>Children who do not meet immunization requirements or do not have documentation of a scheduled appointment within two weeks of turning 11 years of age will be excluded from school beginning the first school day.</u>

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation will be available for the following students:

- Elementary students who live more than 2.0 miles from their school
- High school students who live more than 2.5 miles from their school
- Students whose IEP include transportation services
