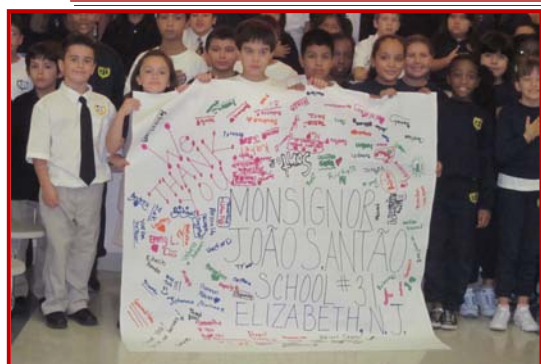

Student of the Month

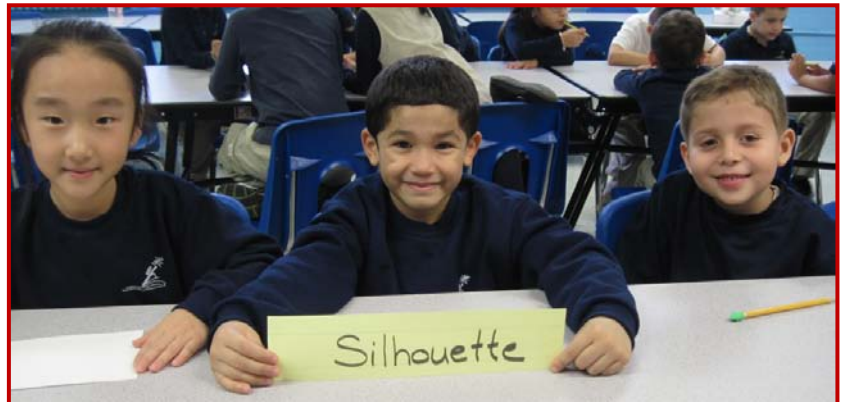

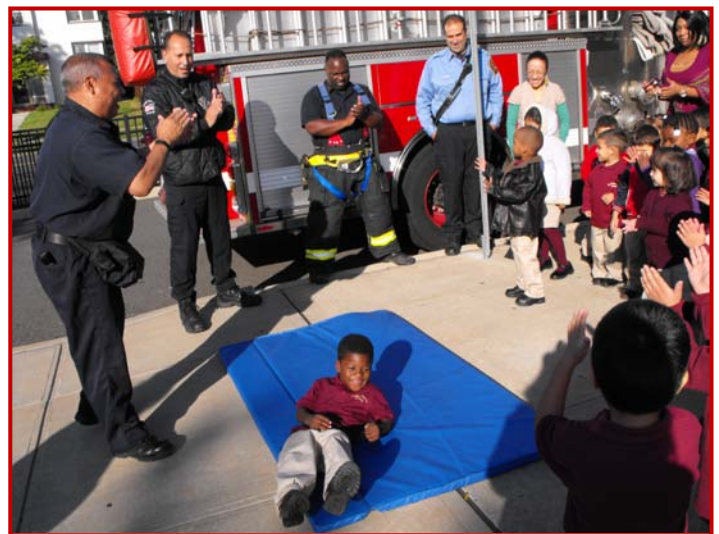
Sharing Merck Institute Science Techniques
