**WHEREAS** the Union County Educational Services Commission has agreed to handle the purchasing and processing of nonpublic school security aid program, security services, equipment or technology for local public school districts for the purpose of greater cost effectiveness through joint purchasing and centralized administration,

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Elizabeth Board of Education enter into an agreement with the Union County Educational Services Commission whereby the Commission will administer a nonpublic security aid program for those eligible students attending nonpublic schools located within its district for the 2016-2017 school year, in accordance with A-2689/5754; and
