


The "Magic" of Performing Arts

Apple Visits School No. 7








Collecting for US Marines

Circus World, a show of their art was shown at the Snyder Academy.


Paper models of carousels and paintings/collages of Ferris wheels, circus tents and the funny antics of clowns filled the gallery.
