RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS, the United States of America is a nation of immigrants and has been from its inception; and
- **WHEREAS,** throughout our national history, immigrants have created, developed and maintained our country in all areas including education, health, commerce, defense, science, culture, and the arts; and
- **WHEREAS,** despite periods of hostility toward immigrants, our country, time and time again, has promoted the assimilation of immigrants into American society; and
- **WHEREAS,** despite the assimilation of immigrants into American society, the current national legal system of immigration has grown increasingly complex and dysfunctional, to the point where an estimated 2.1 million undocumented youth currently reside in the United States without the opportunity to pursue an education or to otherwise contribute to American society; and
- **WHEREAS,** these undocumented youth entered the country as children and know only the United States of America as their home; and
- **WHEREAS,** the DREAM Act would provide certain undocumented youth, who arrived in this country as minors, with a credible path to legal residency by satisfying certain conditions, among them graduating from high school, receiving a GED, and attending college, or serving in our country's armed forces; and
- **WHEREAS,** the DREAM Act would also provide a path to citizenship upon the satisfaction of a number of conditions, including the maintenance of good moral character and the payment of fees; and
- **WHEREAS,** the DREAM Act would repeal the current penalty for states that provide in-state tuition without regard to immigration status; and
- **WHEREAS,** the DREAM Act will validate the significant American public support, including public education, that these youths have received, by creating a viable pathway to citizenship; and
- **WHEREAS,** the DREAM Act will promote a sustainable national economy for the United States by providing corporate and government entities, including educational institutions and health care organizations, with a highly-educated workforce and military, and by providing the United States with a multilingual workforce to compete in an increasingly globalized economy; and
- **WHEREAS,** the DREAM Act has been endorsed by Americans from all areas of our society as an expression of our fundamental value of fairness.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Elizabeth Board of Education calls upon the Congress of the United States of America to enact the DREAM Act.
