NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, effective September 3, 2015, the maximum enrollment of Elizabeth students for whom the Commission provides an alternative educational program through June 30, 2016 shall be increased by twenty-four full-time students, and one of which shall be a forty-five day placement as needed by the Board.

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Elizabeth Board of Education shall pay \$4,000,927 for two hundred three (203) full time students and for the one (1) forty-five (45) day placement students a per diem tuition rate of \$110.00 payable in accordance with the terms of the Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the location of the alternative program shall be as follows: one hundred-eight (108) students shall attend Hillcrest Academy South, ninety-five (95) students shall attend Hillcrest Academy North and the one (1) forty-five (45) day placement shall be provided at Hillcrest Academy North. Except as modified and amended by the foregoing provision, all other terms of the Agreement remain the same.

WHEREAS, the Elizabeth Board of Education will encourage Green Teams at all district schools by providing networking and educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, keeping our community clean is essential to good citizenship, pride and a feeling of safety and security; and

WHEREAS, a program of promoting recycling, stewardship of our schools, accountability to each other and monitoring of the conditions of our schools and neighborhoods, we can help make a positive contribution to the condition of our neighborhoods, and

WHEREAS, as a institution of education, we have the ability to inform and educate everyone in our school community of the importance of a litter free-zone and a positive recycling culture.
