WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy, through Executive Order No. 103, declared a Public Health Emergency and State of Emergency throughout the State of Emergency due to the public health crisis created by the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has implemented emergency measures and community spread mitigation strategies to curtail the pandemic's surge; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has experienced significant upticks in the rate of reported new cases across all counties, demonstrating the need for many of the State's current measures to remain in place, both to reduce additional new infections and to save lives; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey's COVID-19 vaccination program is currently underway; and
