

# Video on Social Media Threatening Violence

It has been brought to our attention that a video is circulating on various social media platforms, including TikTok and SnapChat, warning of nationwide school shootings on December 17. At this time, the New Jersey Regional Operations and Intelligence Center is <u>unaware of any specific, credible threats to any New Jersey Schools</u>.


Law enforcement had been made aware of the videos that had surfaced and it was determined that the social media post was generic. It does not specifically mention by name Elizabeth Public Schools, any of our individual schools, or any other schools or districts in New Jersey as a target of any potential violence.

Please understand that we will continue to take all of these allegations seriously and, as a result, the Elizabeth Police Department will have an increased presence around our schools tomorrow.

# Staying Home When Sick/Exposed to COVID

Providing students and team members a safe learning environment is our top priority. Students and team members should stay home if they:

- Have tested positive (viral test) for COVID-19
- Have pending COVID-19 test results
- Are sick
- Are not fully vaccinated and have had close contact\* with a person with COVID-19 in the past 14 days

# **COVID-19 Transmission Level – Union County**

Union County, along with the remaining 20 counties in the State of New Jersey, has recently returned to the ORANGE designation on the state's COVID-19 transmission level map, which indicates there is a **High Risk** of COVID transmission.



# Exclusions Criteria for Persons with COVID-19, COVID-19 Compatible Symptoms and Close Contacts

Union County is currently designated **ORANGE**, which indicates there is a **High Risk** of COVID transmission. Below are the exclusions based on being in an orange designated region

Exclusion Type	High Risk Exclusion Protocol
<b>COVID-19 positive</b> (viral test), symptomatic or asymptomatic	Exclude according to COVID-19 exclusion criteria
	Identify and exclude school-based contacts for <u>14 days</u> from last exposure and report to local health department.
<b>COVID-19 – compatible symptoms</b> but <b>not tested</b> for COVID-19	Exclude according to COVID-19 exclusion criteria
COVID-19 – compatible symptoms and Negative COVID-19 test (viral test) <sup>1</sup>	Exclude individual through 24 hours after their fever has ended without the use of fever reducing medications and other symptoms improve
Close contact of staff or student with COVID-19	Close contacts of a COVID-19 case who are not fully vaccinated should be excluded for <u>14 days</u> from date of last contact

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Symptomatic individuals with high likelihood of COVID-19 (for example, who are close contacts of confirmed COVID-19 cases) who test negative by rapid antigen test should undergo confirmatory testing with a molecular test (for example RT-PCR)

# **Exclusions From School**


Parents should not send students to school when sick. For school settings the NJ Department of Health recommends that students with the following symptoms be promptly isolated from others and excluded from school:

- At least <u>two</u> of the following symptoms: fever (measure or subjective), chills, rigors (shivers), myalgia (muscle aches), headache, sore throat, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, congestion or runny nose; OR
- At least <u>one</u> of the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new olfactory disorder, new taste disorder

# **Exclusions From School**

### Tips for symptom checking

- Recognize your symptoms
- Visit a pediatrician/doctor if you believe your symptoms are illness related
- Get tested if you are experiencing symptoms related to COVID-19 and have suspicion you may have COVID
- Stay home while COVID test results are pending



# Exclusions From School – Close Contact


- \*A **close contact** is defined by the CDC as someone who was less than 6 feet away from infected person (laboratory-confirmed or a clinical diagnosis) for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period (for example, three individual 5-minute exposures for a total of 15 minutes).
  - This definition excludes students in K-12 classroom settings or structured outdoor settings where mask use can be observed who were between 3 to 6 feet of an infected student (laboratory-confirmed or a clinical diagnosis) if both the infected student and the exposed student(s) correctly and consistently wore well-fitting masks the entire time.
  - This exception does not apply to teachers, staff, or other adults in the indoor classroom setting.

# Exclusions From School — Close Contact (cont.)

#### Close contact (cont.)

- Fully vaccinated persons who have close contact with someone with COVID-19 do not need to be excluded from school if they are asymptomatic but should be referred for testing 3-5 days after exposure.
- Individuals who have been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the past 90 days
  who have close contact with someone with COVID-19 and are
  asymptomatic <u>do not</u> need to be excluded from school and <u>do not</u> need
  to be tested.


