



Algebra I Enrollment by Grade Level









Grade 11 High School Proficiency Assessment Mathematics - Total Population 2005 - 2012


Percentage of Students Passing HSPA- Language Arts




Percentage of Students Passing HSPA- Mathematics




Students Enrolled In AP Classes




Number of AP Exams Taken




